## REMEB will be present at the Regional Climate InfoDay to be held next 10th November in Valencia, Spain

- ✓ The project, led by FACSA and made up for more than ten European partners under the Horizon 2020 programme, aims at developing an eco-friendly ceramic membrane bioreactor (MBR) made from industrial and agricultural wastes for wastewater reuse
- ✓ Professor Enrique Sánchez from Universitat Jaume I of Castellón (Spain), member of the project consortium, will participate in a presentation where he will discuss the criteria that characterize this initiative regarding sustainability, climate, environment, water, eco-innovation, resource efficiency and raw materials

Remeb project, whose objective is the creation and development of an innovative membrane based on recycled materials from ceramics industry and agricultural processes that allows water treatment, will be actively present in the Regional Climate Info Day, to be held on 10th November in Valencia, Spain and organized by the Network of Valencian Universities for the promotion of Research, Development and Innovation (RUVID).

The project, leaded by the company FACSA and bringing together eleven European partners, is framed within the Horizon 2020 programme. Among other objectives, it seeks the valorisation of wastes from various agricultural and industrial processes, as well as the corresponding validation of a new process for water treatment MBR, with a lower cost and more sustainable than existing ones.

To talk about it, the event will include the participation of Enrique Sanchez, Professor of Chemical Engineering at the University Jaume I of Castellón. He

will detail in a practical way characteristics of this type of projects which are part of European priorities for innovation and environment.

This Infoday is one various thematic and networking information conferences organized by the Valencian Community in Spain in collaboration with CDTI (Spanish Centre for Industrial Technological Development), IVACE (Valencian Institute for Business Competitiveness), RUVID, SEIMED (Enterprise Europe Network Valencian Consortium) and REDIT (Network of Technological Institutes of the Valencian Community) to delve into the features of the work programme 2016-2017 and the challenges and priorities of the EU funding programme for research and innovation Horizon 2020.

The conference programme firstly will include an analysis of the results of the period 2014/2015 calls and then will expound the latest news and topics for next 2016/2017 calls in this area. After that, a panel debate composed of researchers experienced in projects in these fields, where Professor Enrique Sanchez is invited to participate, will address practical recommendations.
